## THE NINE HOSTS OF ANGELS

### SERAPHIM

These are the highest order or choir of angels. They are the angels who are attendants or guardians before God's throne. They praise God, calling, "Holy Holy Holy is the Lord of Hosts". The only Bible reference is Isaiah 6:1-7. One of them touched Isaiah's lips with a burning coal from the altar, cleansing him from sin. Seraphim have six wings.

### CHERUBIM

Cherubim rank after the seraphim and are the second highest in the nine hierarchies or choirs of angels. The Old Testament does not reveal any evidence that the Jews considered them as intercessors or helpers of God. They were closely linked in God's glory. Catholic tradition describes them as angels who have an intimate knowledge of God and continually praise Him.

### THRONES

Thrones are the Angels of pure humility, peace and submission. They reside in the area of the cosmos where material form begins to take shape. The lower Choir of Angels need the Thrones to access God.

### DOMINIONS

Dominions are Angels of Leadership. They regulate the duties of the angels, making known the commands of God.

### VIRTUES

Virtues are known as the Spirits of Motion and control the elements. They are sometimes referred to as "the shining ones." They govern all nature. They are also in charge of miracles and provide courage, grace, and valour.

### POWERS

Powers are Warrior Angels against evil, defending the cosmos and humans. They are known as potentates. They fight against evil spirits who attempt to wreak chaos through human beings.

### ARCHANGELS

Archangels are generally taken to mean "chief or leading angel", they are the most frequently mentioned throughout the Bible. They may be of this or other hierarchies as St. Michael Archangel, who is a princely Seraph. The Archangels have a unique role as God's messenger to the people at critical times in history and salvation as in The Annunciation and Apocalypse.

### PRINCIPALITIES

In the New Testament Principalities refers to one type of spiritual (metaphysical) being which are now quite hostile to God and human beings. Along with the principalities are the powers; and cosmological powers; Dominions and thrones.

### ANGELS

These angels are closest to the material world and human beings. They deliver prayers to God and God's answers and other messages to humans. They are the most caring and social to assist those who ask for help.

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**27th September - Memoria of St Vincent de Paul** - St Vincent de Paul was born in Gascony, France in 1581 and ordained a priest at the early age of twenty. Legend says he endured a period of captivity in Tunis; at any rate, after being falsely accused of theft, he dedicated himself to evangelising the poor, the unfortunate and the suffering. He founded the Congregation of Priests of the Mission (Lazarists) and, together with St Louise de Marillac, the Daughters of Charity. These congregations, together with the well-known Society of St Vincent de Paul, continue his charitable work today. St Vincent died in 1660 and is the patron of charitable societies.

**29th September - Feast of the Archangels** - This Feast day celebrates the three archangels named in Sacred Scripture, reminding us of the angelic world and of their constant ministrations to the world.

*St Michael* (meaning 'Who is like God') is venerated as captain of the heavenly army, victor over Satan, protector of the Church and helper of the sick and dying. This feast originated as that of the dedication of a Roman basilica in his honour. He is the patron of the police and the military.

*St Gabriel* (meaning 'Strength of God') announced both the birth of St John the Baptist (to Zechariah) and of Jesus Christ (to the Blessed Virgin Mary). His greeting at the Annunciation, 'Hail, full of grace', has become one of the most familiar prayers. He is the patron of messengers, those who work for broadcasting and telecommunications such as radio and television, postal workers, clerics, diplomats, and stamp collectors.

*St Raphael* (meaning 'God heals') took care of Tobias on his journey, as described in the book of Tobit. He is a patron of the blind, travellers and physicians and nurses.

**30th September - Memoria of St Jerome** - St Jerome (Hieronymus) was born in Strido, now in Croatia, around 342, and went on to study for the priesthood in Rome, where he was baptised. He retired for a while to Syria to live as a hermit and learnt Hebrew from a rabbi. Between 382 and 385 he was in Rome as secretary to Pope Damasus, who commissioned him to revise the Latin version of the Bible. He went to Bethlehem to concentrate on this work, together with the writing of Scriptural commentaries and theological works. He died in 420. He is the patron of librarians and libraries as well as archivists, translators and encyclopedists.

**1st October - Memoria of St Therese of Lisieux** - St Therese Martin was born at Alencon in 1873, at the age of fifteen she entered the Carmel of Lisieux, thus joining two of her sisters. Although she died of tuberculosis at the age of twenty four, such was the influence of her spiritual writings and her 'little way' that she was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. She is also patron of the Missions and co-patron of France.

**2nd October - Memoria of the Holy Guardian Angels** - The Church sets today to celebrate those angels, who, according to Scripture and tradition, guard and assist us at every moment. Each person has such a Guardian Angel and we rightly rejoice in their company.
